## GENERAL INFORMATION (Format of the Event)

| 1. Disciplines: | Rifle |
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| 2. Type of Event: | Team (three (3) athletes from each nation.) |
| 3. Name of Event | Air Rifle Team Men Air Rifle Team Women Air Rifle Team Men Junior Air Rifle Team Women Junior |
| 4. Number of participants in each Team | A Federation can enter one (1) Team of each gender in each event. |
| 5. Number of stages | 2 stages: <br> - Qualification (consists of 2 parts) <br> - Final (consists of a Bronze Medal Match and a Silver/Gold Medal Match) |
| 6. Targets | Electronic Scoring Targets for Qualification and the Final. |
| 7. Tied scores in Qualification | Tied scores for progression to the next stage will be decided according to ISSF Rules. |
| 8. Scoring in Qualification | Decimal (according to ISSF rules) |
| 9. Malfunctions in Qualification | Malfunctions will be governed according to ISSF Rules. |
| 10. Qualification part 1 (Team score) | The Team score will be the total of the scores of each Team member in the individual event. |
| 11. Qualification part 2 | The top 8 ranked Teams from Qualification part 1 will take their places at firing points allocated randomly by software according to the Start list, <br> Athletes will be positioned at a designated part of the range with a reserve firing-point between each Team. |
| Call to the line: | The Chief Range Officer (CRO) will command athletes to, |


| Preparation and Sighting Time: <br> Number of shots to be fired: | "Take your positions" ten (10) minutes before the scheduled Start time of Part 2. <br> Team scores from Qualification part 1 are not carried forwards to part 2. All Teams start from zero. <br> Five (5) minutes for preparation and unlimited sighting shots. <br> Each athlete will fire 20 match shots (total 60 shots per Team), in a time limit of 20 minutes. <br> Each athlete fires independently of their Team members. <br> The scores of each Team member will be added together and the Team results will be ranked. The four (4) top-ranked Teams will progress to the Finals. <br> Teams ranked $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ will compete against each other in the Gold Medal Match. <br> Teams ranked $3^{\text {rd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ will compete against each other in the Bronze Medal Match. |
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| 12. Final (Medal Matches) | The Final consists of a Bronze Medal Match followed by a Gold/Silver Medal Match. The procedure for conducting both Matches will be the same, with appropriate wording used by the CRO in each case. <br> All twelve (12) athletes who qualify for the Final must report to the Finals Range Preparation Area, with all necessary equipment, at least 30 minutes before the scheduled Start Time. A two-point (2) penalty will be deducted from the score of the first competition series if one or two Team members do not report on time. Each Team may be accompanied by one Coach. <br> If the Victory Ceremony is scheduled after the Final, all athletes must report with a national team uniform appropriate for a Victory Ceremony. Juries must complete equipment checks during the reporting period and as soon as possible after each athlete reports. <br> Athletes in the Bronze Medal Match, or their Coaches, must be allowed to place their equipment on their designated firingpoints at least 15 minutes before the scheduled Start time. They must then leave the range to await being called to the line. <br> No bags or transport-boxes may be left on the Field of Play. <br> No bib numbers will be worn in the Medal Matches. |
| 13. Format of Medal Matches | After athletes have been called to the line, they will be allowed three (3) minutes preparation and sighting time. |

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| Medal-Matches | After at least five (5) minutes, from the end of the Bronze <br> Medal Match, and after those athletes have left the range, the <br> targets have been checked by the RTS Jury and the CRO <br> has declared, "Range clear", athletes for the Gold/Silver <br> Medal Match, or their Coaches, must be allowed to place <br> their equipment on their firing-points. They must then leave <br> the range to await being called to the line. |
| 18. Presentation of Medallists | After the Gold and Silver Medal Match has finished, the <br> athletes must be joined on the Field of Play by the Bronze <br> medallists and line up for official photographs and <br> announcements, as in the Individual Finals. |
